The stage affords visitors a nice view of the numerous cherry and maple trees below that erupt in a sea of color in spring and fall, as well as of the city of Kyoto in the distance. In 1994, the temple was added to the list of UNESCO world heritage sites. □ Nijo Castle: Built in 1603 as the Kyoto residence of Tokugawa leyasu, the first shogun of the Edo Period (1603-1867). His grandson lemitsu completed the castle's palace buildings 23 years later and further expanded the castle by adding a five story castle keep. □ Origami Experience: Origami is the art of folding paper into different shapes without using glue or scissors. Common folding objects include animals, flowers, balloons, planes and boats. The area has been a popular destination since the Heian Period (794-1185), when nobles would enjoy its natural setting. Arashiyama is particularly popular during the cherry blossom and fall color seasons. The Togetsukyo Bridge is Arashiyama's well known, central landmark. Many small shops, restaurants and other attractions are found nearby, including Tenryuji Temple, Arashiyama's famous bamboo groves and pleasure boats that are available for rent on the river.

□ Kinkakuji Temple: Kinkakuji (Golden Pavilion) is a Zen Kinkakuji is an impressive structure built overlooking a large pond, and is the only building left of Yoshimitsu's former retirement complex. temple in northern Kyoto whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf.
